AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

AN ACT to amend 66.0416 (title) and 66.0416 (3); and to create 66.0416 (2) (c)
of the statutes; relating to: local regulation of certain businesses operated by
minors.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits a political subdivision from requiring a license or permit for a business, other than a business at which potentially hazardous food is sold, that is operated by a person under the age of 18 and that is operated only occasionally.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 66.0416 (title) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 5 66.0416 (title) Stands Certain businesses operated by minors.
- **SECTION 2.** 66.0416 (2) (c) of the statutes is created to read:
- 7 66.0416 (2) (c) Require a license or permit for a business that is operated by a
- 8 person under the age of 18 and that is operated only occasionally. This paragraph
