**Relating to:** proclaiming November 20, 2019, as Wisconsin's Transgender Day of

Remembrance.
Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance, which occurs annually on
November 20, is a day to memorialize those who have been murdered as a result of
transphobia and to bring attention to the continued violence endured by the
transgender community; and
Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance was founded in 1999 by
Gwendolyn Ann Smith, a transgender woman, to memorialize the murder of
transgender woman Rita Hester in Allston, Massachusetts; and
Whereas, since its inception, Transgender Day of Remembrance has been held
annually on November 20, and it has slowly evolved from the web-based project
started by Smith into an international day of action; and
Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance has been observed in over 185
cities throughout more than 20 countries; and

Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance memorials traditionally include a reading of the names of those who lost their lives during the previous year, and may include other actions, such as candlelight vigils and marches; now, therefore, be it \*Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That\* the Wisconsin Legislature does hereby recognize and proclaim November 20, 2019, to be Wisconsin's Transgender Day of Remembrance.
