Tanning salons-minors.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to ultraviolet tanning devices; prohibiting 2 allowing the use of ultraviolet tanning devices by minors
- 3 under fifteen (15) years of age unless a parent or legal
- 4 guardian is present; requiring parental consent as
- 5 specified for use of ultraviolet tanning devices by minors
- 6 between fifteen (15) and eighteen (18) years of age;
- 7 providing definitions; providing a criminal penalty; and
- 8 providing for an effective date.

- 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 14-3-108 is created to read:

14 14-3-108. Use of ultraviolet tanning devices by

- 15 persons who have not reached the age of majority; presence
- 16 required; consent required; penalty.

2 No person other than the minor's parent or legal 3 guardian shall knowingly allow a minor who has not reached 4 fifteen (15) years of age to use an ultraviolet tanning 5 device, unless the minor's parent or legal guardian consents in writing to the use and is present the entire 6 7 time of use. No person shall knowingly allow a minor age fifteen (15) years to the age of majority to use an 8 9 ultraviolet tanning device, except with written consent 10 obtained from the minor's parent or legal guardian. Any 11 person other than the minor's parent or legal guardian allowing the use of an ultraviolet tanning device by a 12 minor shall demand proof of age prior to allowing the use 13 14 of an ultraviolet tanning device. A motor vehicle driver's license, a registration card issued under the federal 15 16 Selective Service Act, an identification card issued to a 17 member of the armed forces, a valid United States passport, a tribal identification card issued by the governing body 18 of the Eastern Shoshone tribe of Wyoming or the Northern 19 20 Arapahoe tribe of Wyoming or an identification card issued 21 by the department of transportation is prima facie evidence 22 of the age and identity under this section. Proof that the person allowing the use of the ultraviolet tanning device 23 24 demanded, was shown and acted in reasonable reliance upon 1 the information contained in any one (1) of the above

2 documents as identification and proof of age is a defense

3 to any criminal prosecution under this section.

5 (b) Any person violating this section is guilty of a

misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than two 6

7 hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), or both.

9 (c) As used in this section:

10

11 (i) "Consent" means that the parent or legal guardian appears at the first time the minor uses the 12

13 ultraviolet tanning device and signs a written consent form

14 in the presence of the owner or an employee of the

15 facility. The minor's parent or legal guardian may

withdraw this consent at anytime. Unless so withdrawn, 16

17 this consent shall be valid for twelve (12) months from the

date the written consent form is signed. The parent or 18

19 legal guardian must repeat the written consent process

20 annually until the minor reaches the age of majority;

(ii) "Present" means being physically present at 22

the facility at which the tanning device is being used, but 23

does not require the presence in the tanning room or booth 1 2 being used; 3 4 (iii) "Ultraviolet tanning device" means 5 equipment that emits electromagnetic radiation with wavelengths in the air between two hundred (200) and four 6 7 hundred (400) nanometers used for tanning of the skin, including, but not limited to, a sunlamp, tanning booth or 8 9 tanning bed, but does not include equipment that emits ultraviolet radiation used by a health care professional in 10 11 the treatment of disease or used pursuant 12 prescription.

14 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2010.
