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(xx)(xxiii) "This act" means W.S. 33-12-119 through  $\frac{33-12-140}{33-12-142}$ . 33-12-121. Board; membership; appointment; qualifications; term of office; vacancies; removal. (a) The board shall consist of  $\frac{\text{five }(5)}{\text{six }(6)}$  members appointed by the governor. Each member Three (3) members shall be a cosmetologist cosmetologists licensed in Wyoming, and at least one (1) of whom shall be an instructor of cosmetology licensed in Wyoming. Each member of cosmetologist appointed

to the board shall be a resident of Wyoming with have at least five (5) years of experience as a cosmetologist in Wyoming immediately preceding the appointment. Three (3) members shall be barbers licensed in Wyoming, each of whom shall have at least five (5) years of experience as a barber in Wyoming immediately preceding the appointment. All members shall be residents of Wyoming. Appointments shall represent various geographical areas of Wyoming. The term of each appointee shall be three (3) years, unless sooner removed from the board, or until a successor is appointed. The terms shall be staggered so that the terms of not more than two (2) members expire each year. The members of the board holding office on

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1 the effective date of this act shall serve as members for the
2 remainder of their respective terms.

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- 4 (b) No member of the board shall be affiliated with or
- 5 hold interest in any cosmetology school or any school of
- 6 <u>barbering</u> while serving as a member of the board.

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- 8 (c) Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term.
- 9 The governor shall remove any board member whose cosmetology
- 10 license has been suspended or revoked. The governor may remove
- 11 any board member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202.

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13 33-12-123. Duties of board members.

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15 (a) Within the limitations and authority granted by 16 this act, the board shall:

- 18 (i) Develop rules setting uniform and reasonable
- 19 standards of competency for the <u>licensing</u>, practice and
- 20 teaching of <u>barbering</u>, cosmetology, <u>manicuring or</u> nail
- 21 technology, esthetics or hair styling, for the operation of
- 22 <u>salons licensed establishments</u> and schools, and procedures
- 23 for its own conduct. In promulgating rules under this

1 paragraph the board shall require a uniform number of hours of study for each profession authorized by this act as is 2 3 reasonably practicable; 4 5 (ii) Administer examinations to determine competency for licensure of barbers, cosmetologists, 6 manicurists or nail technicians, estheticians, hair stylists 7 8 and instructors; 9 10 Annually inspect, or appoint persons to  $(\Lambda)$ inspect, all salons—licensed establishments and schools for 11 proper licensure of the salon, licensed establishment or 12 school and all <a href="mailto:barbers">barbers</a>, cosmetologists, <a href="mailto:manicurists or nail">manicurists or nail</a> 13 technicians, estheticians, hair stylists whether practicing 14 as a proprietor, employee or independent contractor, or 15 16 instructors practicing or teaching and for the purpose of 17 determining compliance with the provisions of this act and board rules. Licensed establishments and schools in the state 18 19 of Wyoming shall be open to county health officers, members 20 of the board and the board's inspectors or representatives 21 during business hours;

1 (b) The member of the board who is an instructor shall

2 not conduct examinations or train or supervise examiners

3 <u>conducting examinations under this act.</u>

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5 33-12-126. Executive director; duties; accountability;

6 compensation.

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8 The board shall employ an executive director who shall be responsible for the administration of this act and rules of 9 10 the board, and other duties as the board may direct. 11 executive director shall be a cosmetologist or barber 12 licensed in Wyoming and qualified by education experience. The executive director may act in the board's 13 behalf during the period between meetings on matters of 14 15 licensure, applications for examination and other administrative functions. 16 The executive director shall be 17 responsible for the coordination and security of board examinations, shall assist the board members with adoption of 18 19 rules and regulations, shall assist in legislative matters, 20 shall attend board meetings and assist in implementation of 21 board decisions. The annual salary of the executive director shall be determined by the state personnel division. 22

executive director shall receive mileage and per diem

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1 allowance for expenses incurred in the performance of

2 official duties as provided for other state employees.

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4 33-12-127. Licenses required; failure to comply; fines.

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6 (a) From and after the effective date of this act, No person shall engage in the practice or instruction of 7 8 barbering, cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, 9 esthetics or hair styling and no place shall be maintained 10 and operated for the practice or teaching of barbering, 11 cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair 12 styling except under a license issued in compliance with this

act and the rules adopted pursuant to this act.

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(b) No school or salon—licensed establishment shall 15 16 employ, hire or in any manner allow any individual to practice 17 teach <u>barbering</u>, cosmetology, <u>manicuring or</u> nail technology, esthetics or hair styling unless that individual 19 has a current license to practice or teach the applicable 20 specific practice of <u>barbering</u>, cosmetology, <u>manicuring</u> or 21 nail technology, esthetics or hair styling.

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1 (c) The licenses required in subsections (a) and (b) of 2 this section shall: 3 4 Be issued in the name of the licensed barber, cosmetologist, manicurist or nail technician, esthetician, 5 hair stylist, instructor, owner of the salon licensed 6 establishment or owner of the school; 7 8 9 (d) Any person who practices or teaches barbering, 10 cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair styling for compensation, or who carries on any business, 11 12 practice or operation governed by this act, without the 13 applicable license when a license is required, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon conviction, by a fine of not 14 more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00). 15 16 17 (e) Upon request of a licensee, the board may issue a certificate to the licensee to practice activities authorized 18 19 under the license as an independent contractor within a salon 20 <u>licensed establishment</u>. The board may charge an additional fee for the issuance of the certificate as established 21

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pursuant to W.S. 33-12-139.

1 (f) Barbers, cosmetologists, nail technicians, estheticians and hair stylists licensed under this act may 2 3 engage in the practice for which they are licensed in the 4 same licensed establishment that is licensed under the provisions of this act. 5 6 7 33-12-128. Form; expiration; renewal of license; 8 furnishing printed matter. 9 10 (a) The board shall prescribe the form and expiration 11 date of licenses. Licenses may be renewed by submitting the 12 required application for renewal and fee to the board before the license expiration date. 13 14 (b) If a barber, cosmetologist, manicurist or nail 15 technician, esthetician, hair stylist or instructor license 16 17 is allowed to expire, the license may be renewed within a period of ninety (90) days after the expiration date, but 18 19 after the expiration of ninety (90) days from the date the 20 license expired the license shall lapse. 21 (c) All permits, licenses or other printed matter 22

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necessary to carry out the provisions of this act shall be

provided and issued by the board, and at no expense to the

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2 state. 3 4 33-12-129. Expired and lapsed licenses; relicensure. 5 If a salon-licensed establishment or school license is allowed 6 to expire a reinstatement fee for late renewal shall be 7 8 imposed. A <u>barber</u>, cosmetologist, <u>manicurist or</u> nail technician, esthetician, hair stylist or instructor license 9 10 which has lapsed may be reinstated subject to payment of a 11 reinstatement fee in addition to license fees for the lapsed 12 period. Any person whose license has lapsed for five (5) years or more, and who does not qualify for licensure by 13 endorsement, shall be required to complete a refresher course 14 of one hundred (100) hours at a licensed school before 15 16 applying for examination and shall then be required to take 17 the board examination. 18 19 33-12-130. Licensure by examination. 20 21 (a) An applicant for admission to board examination for a license shall meet the following requirements: 22

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1 Be a graduate of a barber, cosmetology, (i) manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair styling 2 3 school and have met training requirements comparable to those 4 set forth in board rules; 5 The board shall issue a license to persons 6 (b) successfully passing the a board licensing examination and 7 8 meeting all requirements of this act and of the board. 9 10 33-12-131. Time, place and scope of examinations. 11 12 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, examinations shall be held at least six (6) times a year at 13 a time and place designated by the board. The examinations 14 15 shall be conducted by the board or a majority thereof held in 16 the presence of at least one (1) member of the board except 17 as provided in W.S. 33-12-123(b) or a qualified examiner as determined by board rule. 18 19 20 (b) The examinations shall not be confined to any 21 specific method or system, may consist of written, oral and performance examinations and shall be of such scope and

character as to disclose that any person passing

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1 examination is qualified to receive a cosmetologist, 2 manicurist or nail technician, esthetician, hair stylist or 3 instructor license. 4 (c) Each applicant for an examination shall make 5 application to the board on forms prepared and furnished by 6 the board and shall submit proper credentials and all required 7 8 fees as required by the board not less than fifteen (15) days before the examination is to be given. 9 10 11 (d) An applicant for a license who fails to pass an 12 examination conducted by the board may be examined at the next examination. 13 14 (e) The board may declare forfeit the examination fee 15 16 of any applicant who fails to appear for examination at two (2) successive meetings of the board for the examination of 17 18 applicants. 19 20 33-12-132. Licensure by endorsement. 21

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An applicant for a license to practice or instruct barbering,

cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair

styling in Wyoming who is a qualified and currently licensed 1 barber, cosmetologist, manicurist or nail technician, 2 3 esthetician, hair stylist or instructor in another state, 4 upon submitting an application to the board, a certification 5 from the board or licensing agency of the state in which the applicant is licensed, proof of meeting the requirements of 6 this section and payment of the required fee, may receive a 7 8 cosmetologist, manicurist or nail technician, esthetician, 9 hair stylist or instructor license by endorsement without 10 examination in this state. An applicant from another state 11 which does not require a board examination for licensure, or 12 an applicant who did not attend a barbering, cosmetology, 13 manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair styling school meeting requirements of the rules of the board and the 14 15 licensing entity of the state in which the school is located, 16 shall not obtain a Wyoming license by endorsement. 17 applicant from another state who has not practiced 18 cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair 19 styling full time for at least one (1) year prior to 20 application shall obtain a Wyoming license by endorsement 21 only if he was licensed under requirements which the board 22 determines to be at least equal to those established pursuant to this act. 23

- 11 promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of
- 12 this act including rules to transition existing manicurist
- 13 and barber licenses and certificates of registration and
- 14 existing barbershop and school licenses to licenses
- 15 authorized by the provisions of this act.
